

# THE SLINGER FOOD PANTRY IS GRATEFUL FOR YOU!

December was a busy month for the Slinger Food Pantry and FPCR. Cathy Romanski reported that the Pantry clientele increased by over 30 families between Thanksgiving and Christmas! It seems there are always more people in need of FPCR's donations. To help address this increased need, FPCR repeated the 2023 "Reverse Advent" Food Drive. One needed item a day was placed in a box during Advent and resulted in a wonderful box of staples, and even a few "goodies" for the Pantry shelves.

FPCR's "Peanut Butter/Canned Goods Tree" netted 94 items and FPCR's 2024 Reverse Advent drive added another 434 items for a total of **528** food items to help those who are hungry this winter. Additionally, **\$720** was sent in monetary donations for the last quarter of this year!

The Food Pantry and its clients are very appreciative of your thoughtful giving and are continually amazed by the level of your generosity. **Thank you to each and every one who has donated to or helped the Pantry in some way during 2024.** That includes purchasing, counting, loading and delivering as well as writing checks!
